There are now over 400 records in the database, a total that is growing on an almost daily basis. It now also contains a significant number of records from online sources.

The Jervis gedcom file was kindly donated by Dr Graham Jervis and is now available. It contains the details of over a hundred individuals, including about seventy bearing the Crutchley surname, originating in the English Midlands and dating from 1810 onwards.

# William Crutchley (abt 1778 to 1859)

'The very elusive William Crutchley' is the story of my research efforts aimed at positively identifying the father of my fourth great grandfather, born about 1778. It is a genealogical tale with whose frustrations and difficulties most amateur genealogists will identify.

Inevitably, every amateur family historian comes upon a point in their research where the continuity of the existing records breaks down or fundamental errors within them are revealed. Thereafter further progress back through time and the accurate tracing of a lineage is often barred or based on supposition rather than unambiguous proof.

This is the point that I have reached with my own Crutchley research, as William still refuses to reveal himself fully.
